We serve thousands of individuals from over 26 countries through holistic programs, including our Food Share, English classes, community navigation, Worthmore Clinic, and DeLaney Community Farm.

With leadership that reflects the diverse communities we serve, we remain committed to standing with our refugee neighbors, ensuring they feel valued, included, and empowered as they rebuild their lives.

As the needs of our community evolve, we continue to listen, adapt, and grow to provide the support and resources that make a lasting impact.

A Year of Transformation

In October 2024, we celebrated a transformative milestone by breaking ground on our new building. Set for completion in late Fall 2025, this space will dramatically expand our ability to serve the community.

Designed with our future in mind, this space will bring together services that address the many challenges families face as they build new lives. Additional medical, behavioral health, and legal services will help meet critical needs under one roof, while the expansion of our food program will allow us to serve more families with greater dignity and efficiency. A welcoming community event space and courtyard will create opportunities for neighbors to gather, celebrate, and build lasting connections.

This new facility will strengthen Project Worthmore's ability to provide truly wraparound support, ensuring that newcomers have access to the resources, relationships, and opportunities they need, not just today, but for years to come.



Our Programs

Worthmore Clinic

Recognizing the gap in affordable dental care, our clinic offers low-cost, high-quality dental services to newcomers, addressing a significant barrier to health and well-being.

Since 2016, the clinic has served as an ACTS rotation site for the CU dental program, CCD dental hygiene program, and Emily Griffith dental assistant program.

Yu Meh Food Share

Our 5-acre farm provides fresh produce for our Food Share Program while creating meaningful employment opportunities for refugee farmers.

As longtime farmer Abu stepped into leadership, the farm laid the groundwork for a stronger future, investing in new systems, renewed growing practices, and the next chapter of DeLaney Community Farm.

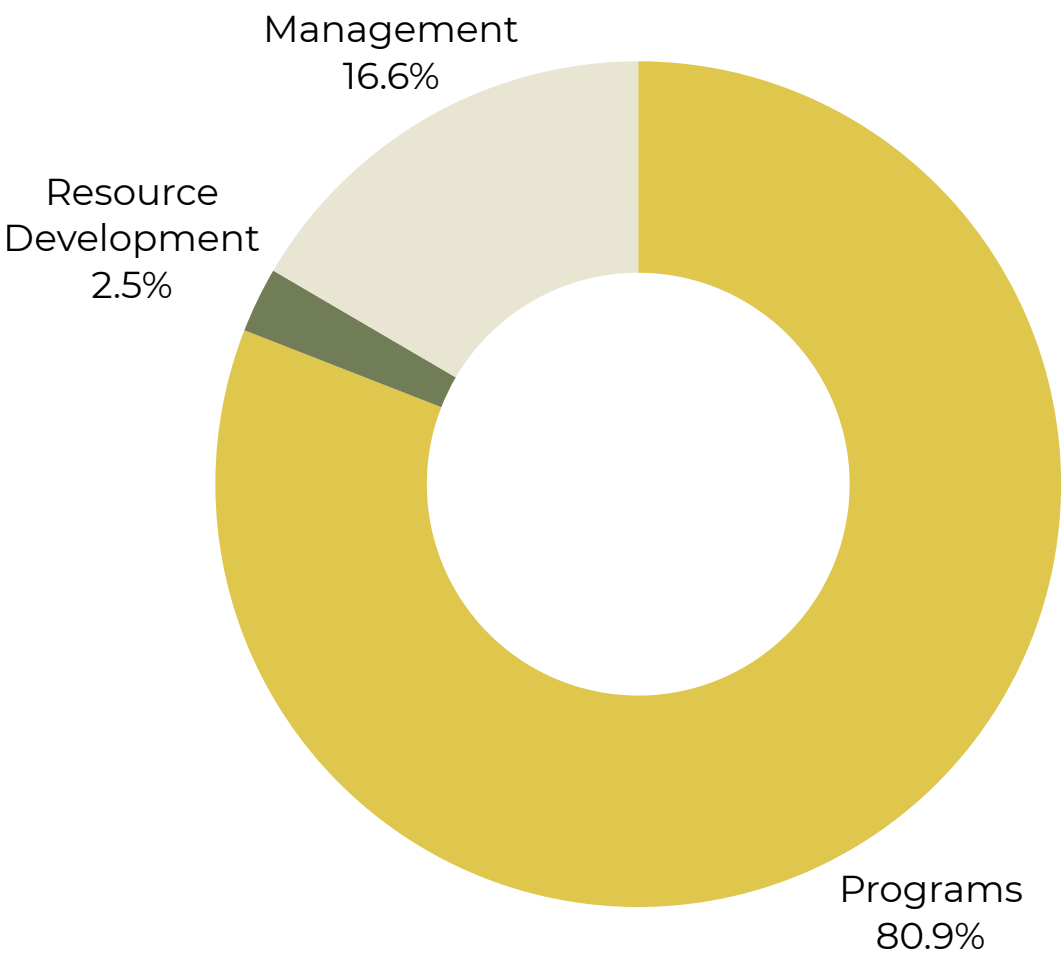
